Book Study of Noises in the Park.

This book study will summarise the themes and voices within Anthony Browne's amazing picture book 'Noises in the Park'.

Firstly, Browne shows a dislike for wealth and social hierarchy and this is shown through Noice One (the lady). As he has portrayed her to be very snobby and negative towards people she doesn't know. Also Browne has designed voice one to show more favoritism towards her dog than her son. Looking deeper into this, the lady dismissed Victoria (her dog) to run freely but ordered Charles to stay and sit beside her as she was irritated by the man who was also on the bench. This was because the man was lower in social hierarchy than herself. She sat as far away as possible. Therefore, proving she is a snobby, uptight, obnoxious and selfish. The uptight woman changes her attitude when she is speaking to her dog as more human than her own son! Building onto this, in the book the lady shouts to Charles to come here but speaks politely towards Victoria. This can prove that she cares more about her dog than her son.

On the other hand, the second voice (the poor man) sounds more down trodden and gloomy because he has no money and can't support his daughter. The only way he is happy is talking to Sudge. She cheers him up by explaining what her day was like and how she feels about certain things in life. Evidence for this is in the book it says "Then it was time to go. Sudge chattered to me happily all the way home."

Secondly, Anthony Browne's book he uses signs and his illustrations to give different points of the characters' feelings and how they come across to the reader. Browne creates his illustrations to tell half of the story. For example, in the book it has Sudge and her dad walking home and the light is shining down onto them. This shows that they are happy even and they can be happy

without money! Another point is the dogs have had their love support and I think Anthony has used this to say that no matter what you look like you are always important and special in your own way. Furthermore, under the picture it says "the two dogs raced around like old friends." Another symbol is when you look carefully into the illustrations you can see different animals, clothing and other strangers within the illustrations.

To summarise, Browne uses his illustrations very effectively to tell a story about his feelings towards social hierarchy and wealth. This method is new to me as other authors do not tackle social issues as this. It's amazing that you can keep on reading and looking and eventually you can spot something you haven't seen before.
